Highlights from Wicked - By Stephen Schwartz, arr. Ted Ricketts

Highlights from Wicked gives us a taste of the dramatic and upbeat music from Stephen Swartz's hit Broadway musical and takes us on a quick journey through Oz, before Dorothy. It features the songs 'No One Mourns the Wicked', 'the Wizard and I', 'Dancing Through Life', 'Popular' and 'Defying Gravity'.

The Sorcerer's Apprentice By Paul Dukas

Like other pieces on this program the Sorcerers Apprentice is based upon a poem of the same name by van Goeth. Unlike other pieces on this program this piece was part of Disney's Fantasia which made it known to a wider audience. Throughout the piece we hear the young apprentice (or Mickey Mouse) enchanting the broomsticks to help him complete his chores, and the madness that follows as he looses control of his helpers.

Eliza Aria from Wild Swans By Elena Kats-Chernin

Written by Elena Kats-Chernin for the ballet the Wild Swans, this piece is inspired by the folk tale of Hans Christian Anderson, where the princess Eliza must break the curse that has turns her brothers into swans. The Eliza Aria is the most well known piece from this ballet, and features a stunning soprano line above the full orchestra.

I Want Magic from A Streetcar Named Desire By André Previn

This "I want magic" aria is one of the few truly lyrical passages in this strident, jagged opera. Here Blanche lays out her desire for a dreamself that bears little relation to humdrum and often-sordid reality. Perhaps, in the end, it's this magical transformative quality in Blanche that so appeals to people like, for example, Spanish filmmaker Pedro Almodóvar, who celebrated Blanche's character in his film Todo sobre mi Madre/All about My Mother. Blanche Dubois, like Almodóvar's cinematic characters, tenaciously believes till the end, even as her fragile hold on reality disintegrates, that there is more truth in dreams than in stark reality.

Berlioz's Symphony Fantastique is a programmatic symphony that tells the tale of a romance that ends in disaster. The movements performed tonight depict the 'March to the Scaffold', in which we hear a man ('the author') being paraded though town on the way to his execution for murdering his love ('the beloved'), and the execution occurring, depicted by the solo clarinet and the strings. This is followed by the final movement the "Witches Sabbath', where we hear the Dies Irae as the witches dance around his grave and merrily drag him down to hell.

Guest Soloist Jessica Blunt



Soprano Jessica Blunt is a graduate of the Royal Academy of Music, London (MA Performance with Distinction and hon. Dip RAM) and Sydney Conservatorium of Music (MMus Opera Performance and BMUS Performance). In London, Jessica was invited to sing with the English National Opera for their Dance for Ukraine gala at the London Coliseum, as well as performing for the Tait Memorial Trust as a scholar in both 2021 & 2022.

Jessica then travelled to Salzburg, Austria for six months as a singer at Stimme, Leib und Seele (SLS), working one-on-one with the likes of Stuart Skelton, Jennifer Condon, and Daniella Sindram. As a result of her work at SLS, she was invited to coach with renown Strauss & Wagner repetiteur Jendrik Springer at the Vienna State Opera in 2022 and 2023.

A two-time recipient of the Henderson Travellers' scholarship, Jessica debuted in Mozart's 'Le nozze di Figaro' (CONTESSA) at the 2018 Mediterranean Opera Studio & Festival in Sicily, and in Die Zauberflöte' (FIRST LADY) at the 2019 Manhattan Opera Studio, New York. In New York, she also performed as a soloist in Carnegie Hall's Weill Recital Hall. Other operatic roles include: Poulenc's 'Les Mamelles des Tiresias' (THERESE); Ravel's 'L'enfant et les sortileges' (LE FEU), Mozart's 'Don Giovanni' (DONNA ELVIRA) and 'La finta giardiniera' (ARMINDA).

In Australia, Jessica performed in the chorus of Opera Australia in 'Don Giovanni' and 'La traviata.' She was soprano soloist for Sydney Town Hall's 'Messiah' in 2019 and was regular soloist for St Mary's Cathedral's 'Red Mass'. Most recently, Jessica won the Fremantle Eisteddfod's Operatic Aria division and performed as a soloist for West Australian Opera's 'Morning Melodies' at His Majesty's Theatre. She had the privilege to cover Desdemona, as well as sing chorus, in WAO's production of Verdi's 'Otello'.



Nightmare Before Christmas By Danny Elfin

The Nightmare before Christmas is a movie, once again based upon a poem, was conceived by Tim Burton. The pumpkin king of halloween town laments that every year the celebrations are the same, and accidentally stumbles into the land of Christmas. This influence can be heard in the score of longtime Tim Burton collaborator Danny Elfman, where he took influences from classical and theatre composers such as Kurt Weill, Gershwin and Gilbert and Sullivan to create this wonderfully macabre Christmas score.

Prélude à l'aprés-midi d'un faune - Claude Debussy

Debussy's Prelude to the Afternoon of the Faun was written as a prelude to be performed before a piece of poetry of the same name by Stéphane Mallarmé. This piece depicts the awakening of a faun in the afternoon sunlight, and is written in a dreamy manner to show the place between sleeping and wakefulness. Featuring exquisite writing for solo flute and other woodwinds, the Prelude to the Afternoon of the Faun takes you to a sunlit filled glade in a forrest, where there may be mythical creatures.

Queen of the Night Aria From the Magic Flute

One of the most famous classical arias the Queen of the Night aria is a stunning showcase of the soprano and was written for Mozarts final opera the Magic Flute. This aria goes from intense to delicate, and showcases the full range and technical talents of our wonderful soprano soloist.
